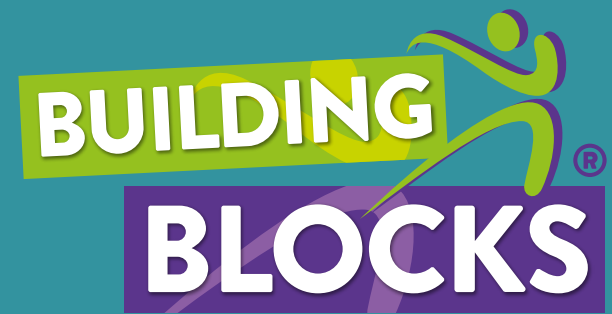


On the Stage



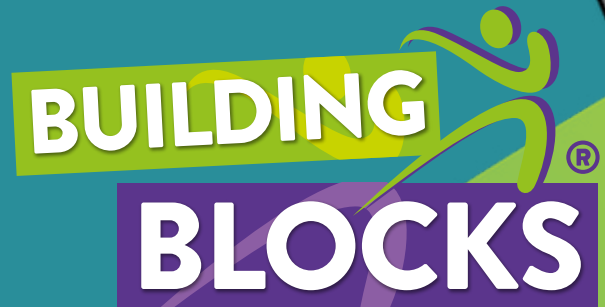
You will need:

- An area designated as a 'stage'
- Fabric squares, scarves, net curtains etc.
- Hats, scarves, belts, bags, glasses, wigs etc.
- Story books
- Music from a mobile device
- Instruments to make music – traditional and home-made e.g. pan lids & wooden spoons
- A microphone
- Bed sheets, shower curtains for back drops and pegs for fastening
- Rolls of paper/large sheets of paper
- Paint, chalk, marker pens...

What to do:

- Hold X Factor/ Britain's Got Talent auditions.
- Perform a nursery rhyme with a friend.
- Dance along to popular songs.
- Tell jokes.
- Create a mime.
- Create and perform a dance sequence/routine.
- Take part in Welsh folk dances.
- Perform Bhangra dances and other traditional dances.
- Sing along with popular songs. Play instruments to accompany the songs.
- Design and make costumes.
- Build and paint scenery.
- Retell a familiar story.
- Make up your own story/play.
- Paint your own face or a sibling's face.
- Practice your performing voice – the louder, the better!

Take it further

Retell a traditional story by putting on a show.

- Decide which traditional story you are going to perform.
- Prepare the theatre seats. Number the seats.
- Decide which days and at what time your show will be performed. Make a poster to advertise it.
- Make tickets. Label the tickets with the seat numbers. Sell your tickets.
- Design and make the scenery.
- Assign roles to the actors and backstage crew.
- Find a suitable costume for each character.
- Have a dress rehearsal.
- Perform your show.
- Make sure that someone is selling ice-creams at the interval!
